About the course/workshop	<p>This workshop will give an introduction to the simplest form of screen printing using paper stencils. We shall cut stencils in thin paper or newsprint. Each stencil will be approx A5 in size and can be printed in one colour. Emily will help each participant to develop their own 2 or 3 colour print based on each person's individual ideas. Come willing to experiment and gain a feel for the medium.</p> <p>The day course will give you the skills needed to be able to use this medium to make work in your own home.</p>		
What students should bring	<p>An apron, wear clothes that can withstand getting paint marks! A craft knife if you have one. Ideas for a design/image - these can be drawings or photographs/photocopies. Emily will have some ideas for people to use too.
