Attendance of Pupil Premium students

PP attendance last year was 93.0% a slight decrease from 93.7% from 2014/15 but an increase from 92.0% in 2013/14.

13 of our Disadvantaged students were a persistent absentees (10% or more) in 2015/16.

Behaviour of Pupil Premium students

No Pupil Premium student was permanently excluded.

Six Pupil Premium students were given Fixed Term Exclusions last year. In all cases special consideration was given, but the incidents were sufficiently serious to warrant exclusion.
