COVID-19 Addendum to Pupil Premium Strategy in relation to the provision of digital devices

To support students with the increased amount of online learning undertaken in response to the COVID-19 crisis, Maiden Erlegh Trust will use Pupil Premium funding to provide digital devices to disadvantaged pupils/students in the following way.

Process (subject to availability)

Stage 1	Headteachers will identify students who are entitled to the Pupil Premium Grant and who are encountering difficulties in accessing online learning due to a lack of hardware and/or internet access at home. Looked After Children will not be included in this process as they are provided for through the PEP process.
Stage 2	for through the PEP process. The Director of Inclusion and Safeguarding will allocate devices and/or internet access hardware, prioritising Pupil Premium students from those lists using the following: • Year 10 students (not provided for through the DfE scheme). • Year 9 students • Year 8 students • Year 7 students
Stage 3	 Families will be gifted their allocated device and ownership will transfer immediately to them. Access is provided without support, guarantee or warranty by Maiden Erlegh Trust Maiden Erlegh ICT Support Staff are not able to assist with either installation or fault finding. We cannot work on home PCs, Laptops, or other mobile devices. Login details may not be shared. Entitlement to install and use this Office 365 free of charge is limited to the pupil/student for the time they remain on roll at a Maiden Erlegh Trust school and is subject to the school continuing to license its software via the Microsoft Office 365 for Education systems.
