About the course/workshop	Discover the wonderful world of lino-printing in this fun workshop.
	After familiarising yourself with the tools and their mark-making possibilities you will create a plate using soft-cut lino (much easier on your hands) ready for printingthe tutor will bring designs for you to use if you wish. Using water-based printing inks you can then experiment and explore the
	possibilities of making a whole series of different but related prints from a single plate, both in monochrome and full colour using techniques such as spot-inking, rainbow rolls, and collage. Lino is perfect for printing at home with a minimum of specialist equipment and mess!
	No experience needed – lots of demos and individual help.
What to bring	Ideas / sketches / reference pictures, no larger than A5 (the tutor will also bring some templates for you to use).
	Kitchen roll, water jars, apron / overall, dessert spoon, Pencil, glue stick, (such as Pritt or Bostik)
	Linocutting tools and roller if you have them (don't buy specially – the tutor will bring some to borrow.)
	Cartridge paper for printing plus any other papers you might want to try. Sketchbook / scrap paper for working out ideas and trial prints.
