Our Disadvantaged Attainment 8 figure was negatively affected by two particular students:
 Student A (MAP) – In order to avoid exclusion was educated off site for almost all of year 11, following a limited number of GCSE courses.

Student B (HAP) – Disengaged from school and attendance was 35% for year 11.

Attendance of Pupil Premium students

PP attendance last year was 92.6% a slight decrease from 93.0% in 2015/16

20 of our Disadvantaged students were a persistent absentees (10% or more) in 2016/17.

This was a significant increase on previous years and will be a key focus for the coming year.

Behaviour of Pupil Premium students

No Pupil Premium student was permanently excluded.

2 Pupil Premium students were given Fixed Term Exclusions last year, one of whom was Student A. In both cases special consideration was given, but the incidents were sufficiently serious to warrant exclusion.

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
