Year 8 - Passport for Life

Maiden Erlegh School runs a scheme known as Passport for Life which most of the Year 7 students took part in last year. This aims to encourage young people to become active participants in their local community, by looking for, organising and undertaking activities designed to help individuals or the community in general.

Your son or daughter will have been told about the scheme at school and will have had a chance to discuss the sort of activities with which they could become involved. When your child has decided on their project or activity, please could they complete the Proposal Form below, which they need to complete and then ask you to read and sign if you agree to their proposal. The form should then be handed into Reception and will be checked and a 'Diary Card' will be issued for your child to record the time spent on each activity. As they are completing their 5 hours, the Passport for Life diary should be completed by the person supervising the activity and your son/daughter should hand this into Reception when 5 hours have been completed. A certificate will be awarded and presented by your child's form tutor.



For example it could be completed by doing an environmental project or by visiting an old people's home. In previous years students have sold Charity Christmas cards in the main school entrance and helped to show parents around on Open Evenings. The activity should not, of course, involve any payment to the students and should not be work solely for the benefit of the student's family.

We are sure that students will come up with all sorts of exciting ideas of their own. Please help your child decide on an appropriate project, and check on its suitability. The students have been told that they must not contact strangers and must only undertake projects that have been fully discussed with you.
