From the Headteacher



A very belated Happy New Year to you all. We have had a tremendous start to the term with lots of things going on already. Year 10 Geographers braved the weather for their field trips last week and Year 7 went outward bound in Tirabad. I would like to also congratulate our Year 10s who

triumphed at the Southern Science and Technology Challenge Final at Queen Mary University. We also have a music trip planned for next week and our Year 12 physics trip to visit CERN leaves this weekend. All of this is on top of the regular PE clubs and fixtures and performing arts groups, and other clubs going on after school. I must thank my colleagues for their commitment to providing such a varied enrichment programme.

This term is a very important term for Year 8 who, apart from taking their assessments, are about to select their options. There is lots of support for them through the pastoral team, including the careers fair on 7 February, our Year 8 Options Evening and then the Year Parents' evening. If you still have specific questions thereafter, Mr Thomas and Mrs Bendall will offer "options surgeries" to talk them through. I would like to praise Year 11 and Year 13 who are working so hard in preparing for their examinations. The pastoral teams are there to support if necessary and I urge students to speak to their tutors if they are worried or concerned.

Numeracy Focus


What is numeracy?

Numeracy is a fundamental life skill which includes essential abilities such as solving problems, understanding and explaining the solutions, making decisions based on logical thinking and reasoning, and interpreting data, charts and diagrams.



Why is numeracy important?


We all need maths, not just for school, but for everyday life, work, and opportunities – 'good numeracy is the best protection against unemployment, low wages and poor health' (Andreas Schleicher, OECD, 2013).



What can you do to help?

Talk to your child about numeracy and be positive about it.

Highlight elements of numeracy in everyday life e.g. whilst shopping, compare products to work out best values for money; how many litres of petrol/diesel can I buy for £20?



Year 11 Revision Corridor

After February half term we will be launching the Year 11 Revision Corridor. This will start on Friday 24 February from 2:20-3:20 and will run every Friday afternoon up until the start of the examination programme in May.

It is a one hour weekly revision drop in area for Year 11 students. It will take place on the H corridor where there will be rooms available to complete silent, independent revision, and rooms to complete group revision. There will also be a weekly 30 minute revision session delivered by a member of staff. Some of these will be open to all students and others will be tailored to individuals or groups and so will be on an invitation only basis.


