Ski Trip 2017

The Maiden Erlegh School annual ski trip went out at Easter with 59 students from Years 8, 9 and 10 accompanied by 8 members of staff.

The prospect of an arduous 20 hour coach journey did not dampen the spirits and leaving late Friday afternoon we travelled across the English Channel and then down through the length of France to the Alpine resort of Claviere, just inside the Italian Border. A remarkably straightforward journey saw us make very good time and we arrived in Claviere on Saturday afternoon. A weary but excited group managed to get all their skis and boots fitted before getting an early night ahead of the first day skiing.

Up bright and early on Sunday, we discovered that the resort had changed somewhat. Where there was grass and tarmac before there was a new fall of over 20cm of fresh snow and it was now a Winter Wonderland. Our students were incredibly well organised and managed to dress and properly equip themselves – a feat in itself as for the vast majority this was their very first experience of skiing on snow. We then jumped on our coach for the short journey to the linked slopes in Montgenevre.

Social Media Concerns

The internet is constantly moving and changing and as parents and teachers we are almost always behind our teenagers and racing to catch up.

Some of you will be aware of the apps and games your children are using, others will not. Have you heard of the following:



Yellow. This is an app which is linked to Snapchat and is best described as Tinder for children. It is designed to help children make friends on Snapchat, but it could very easily be used by predators trying to befriend children.



Say At Me is a website which invites people to 'Get anonymous and honest feedback about yourself.' Owing to its anonymous nature, students using this site could find themselves

the victims of bullying and hate mail.



The Blue Whale Game asks teenagers to take part in an escalating series of self-harm challenges, culminating in suicide. This appears

to have originated in Russia where it is claimed that it has led to the suicides of 130 teenagers. There are reports that it is being played in the UK.
