Supporting children and young people with worries about COVID-19

The internet is full of so much advice for parents that it can be overwhelming.

The government have issued advice here.

It would be sensible to mention to your child that the Childline website has lots of useful information and advice. Even the most resilient children have worries and concerns.

The one recurring theme in all the advice is about connectivity – encourage your children to communicate with their friends and stay in touch using any means available to them.

I have been incredibly impressed with the resilience demonstrated by our students. In a period where there is so much uncertainty they have settled down to carry on with work in a determined fashion, a trait that Maiden Erlegh students always show and one that makes me exceptionally proud of them. I have watched the Year 11 and 13 students carry on with their studies despite the uncertainties around their grades this summer, and I will be writing to the parents and students in these year groups today to update them on the most recent announcement. For Year 10 students due to sit RP this summer, we will be in touch in due course regarding options.

With the ongoing fight against COVID-19 the school has donated 20 pairs of science goggles to the Woodley Centre GP surgery following a request from them. I have also contacted the Royal Berkshire Hospital to offer these and I am pleased to say that on Monday I will be picking up goggles from all 3 Maiden Erlegh Trust secondary schools and delivering over 100 pairs to protect the frontline staff.

Your child has had an assembly uploaded to their Year Group Google Classroom as we believe it is nice to hear someone else's voice outside of those the students live with. We would normally have an assembly at Easter with key messages and we hope that this goes someway to replacing that. Please do keep following our twitter feed for updates from the school.

We are starting to look at student recognition over this difficult period and after Easter we will be doing a virtual student of the week alongside writing to those who have been identified for going above and beyond. We are also monitoring in more detail the work being submitted and teachers will be following the same guidelines for marking as highlighted in Annex 1 in the document below:

I would also like to give you an update on the provision of work being set by teachers. We have listened to the feedback so far and from the survey this week, it seems as though the overwhelmingly majority of students and parents are happy with what is being set. We do appreciate that there have been some access issues for a very small minority but this has now been resolved. Should you have any Google Classroom or access issues please email office@maidenerleghschool.co.uk in the first instance.

For the first two weeks since closure the priority of staff has been ensuring that we have work available for students via Google Classroom and this has given structure to the day for many. The feedback from the survey suggests that this is mainly pitched to the right level and in the right quantity. We have had some requests for live teacher led lessons and whilst we are happy for this to occur (I know many schools are advising staff not to do this) we are also not in a position to make this common practice for a variety of reasons and we hope you will support us on this front. I have asked staff to look at ways in which variety can be added to the work set and I hope you will see an even further improvement in this area after Easter. I would like to acknowledge the work of the staff here at the school who are working incredibly hard to bring some stability to our students' lives. Please remember that school staff are also juggling the impact of COVID-19 with family life, illness and the pressure this has brought on everyone and they have been nothing short of fantastic in their response so far.
