# Notification of positive COVID-19 test result

I am writing to inform you that this evening I have been notified of a Year 11 student testing positive for COVID-19. As a result, and in line with our policy, we will be asking Year 11 to isolate tomorrow, Monday 9 November, whilst we carry out our tracing process. I am aware that Year 11 are due to sit their English Literature paper tomorrow and today we have been planning to ensure this still occurs. **Therefore, tomorrow Year 11 will sit their Literature paper remotely starting at 10am.** Instructions on how to access the paper and log into the virtual room will be on the year group Google Classroom by 9.15am tomorrow.

I will be contacting The Department for Education, Public Health England and Public Health at the Local Authority tomorrow morning to discuss the situation and to clarify the action we need to take.

Whilst I understand this is not the news you hope to hear from the school, I feel it is important that I am as transparent as possible with you.

I would also like to take this opportunity to share information about coronavirus as per the current guidance. Please see below:

### What to do if your child develops symptoms of COVID-19

If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19, they must not come to school and should remain at home for at least **10 days** from the date when their symptoms appeared. Anyone with symptoms will be eligible for testing and this can be arranged via <a href="https://www.nhs.uk/askfor-a-coronavirus-test">https://www.nhs.uk/askfor-a-coronavirus-test</a> or by calling 119.

All other household members who remain well, must stay at home and not leave the house for 14 days. This includes anyone in your 'Support Bubble'.

The 14-day period starts from the day when the first person in the house became ill.

Household members should not go to work, school or public areas and exercise should be taken within the home.

If you require help with buying groceries, other shopping or picking up medication, or walking a dog, you should ask friends or family. Alternatively, you can order your shopping online and medication by phone or online.

Household members staying at home for 14 days will greatly reduce the overall amount of infection the household could pass on to others in the community.

If you are able, move any vulnerable individuals (such as the elderly and those with underlying health conditions) out of your home, to stay with friends or family for the duration of the home isolation period.

## **Symptoms**

The most common symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are recent onset of:

- a new continuous cough
- · a high temperature
- a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia)

# For most people, coronavirus (COVID-19) will be a mild illness.

# How to stop COVID-19 spreading

There are things you can do to help reduce the risk of you and anyone you live with getting ill with COVID-19.

Do

- wash your hands with soap and water often do this for at least 20 seconds
- use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available
- wash your hands as soon as you get home
- cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze
- put used tissues in the bin immediately and wash your hands afterwards
