### From the Headteacher

What a great start to our summer term! We finally welcomed students back through our gates and back into the classroom, we elected a new Student Leadership Team, our Violet College students had an art show, we planned the return of our sporting fixtures, and students threw themselves into multiple house challenges. But most of all, seeing the students walk back through the gates after the latest lockdown was amazing! I entered the teaching profession (many) years ago to work with future generations and not having them on site was a horrible experience and something I hope none of us have to go through again.

I would like to say a huge well done to Year 11 and 13 for completing their assessments. It is unfortunate that their last day plans have had to be postponed, but we cannot wait to give you the send-off you deserve. You have been fantastic!

We were pleased to announce that Maiden Erlegh School has been awarded the provision of a Resource Base for secondary school students with Autism Spectrum Disorder and Social, Emotional and Mental Health Needs by Wokingham Borough Council. Our Indigo Resource Base is set to open to five students in September, with an additional five students joining each year, with a maximum of twenty five. These students will benefit from a dedicated resource space, therapy room, sensory room and specialist SEND classroom. As well as benefiting from a specialist SEND teacher, they will also spend time, with support, in the mainstream classes.

We have also gained the Leading Parent Partnership Award which demonstrates our commitment to working with parents and carers and making sure the school has a real community feel. I believe in the analogy that successful schools are like three legged stools, the legs being students, parents and the school.



### #Careers Week 5 – Celebrating hidden and physical disability awareness in careers *linked to different subject areas*

During the week commencing 10-14 May, we celebrated #Careers Week 5. We continue to raise awareness of disability and equality in careers as part of our theme of diversity and inclusion this academic year. The focus of the week was to explore hidden and physical disability awareness in careers linked to the different subject that students study.

### Year 12 Destinations Workshops

Year 12 students were asked to sign up to an appropriate workshop that best describes their likely intended destination post-18. These sessions helped to support, guide and equip them with relevant information so that they can choose the right pathway when they leave Maiden Erlegh School. Each workshop also provided students with a brief outline of interview and employability skills and the importance of differentiating themselves and a Q&A session. The workshops included advice and support regarding university, apprenticeship, gap year, employment or to those who were currently unsure of their next steps. The feedback we have received has been overwhelmingly positive.

### Year 12 Virtual Work Experience **Placements**


Our expectation is that students complete 30 hours of work experience that is directly related to their chosen career path in either Year 12 or 13. A large majority of students have been taking advantage of the huge number of virtual work experience placements that are currently being offered in place of the normal face-to-face experience. We would recommend that students continue to apply for these virtual placements as we know that universities and apprenticeship providers are increasingly expecting students to have gained first-hand exposure of the workplace, either physically or remotely and this will provide students with concrete examples to make reference to in future personal statements and job applications. Placements are currently on offer from a wide variety of organisations including Spotify, Ofcom, KPMG, Law firms, Brighton and Sussex Medical School, JP Morgan, British Airways, Construction firms, Teaching, Journalism and many others. 


### Work of Art Continued
