Berkshire Leadership Sports Academy

The students heard from Paralympic swimmer Graham Edmunds and how he overcame a serious accident to become a double gold medallist. 
Non-Uniform Day

Women's Suffrage

On 6 February 1918, the UK parliament passed the 'Representation of the People Act' that gave all men, above the age of 21, as well as women, above the age of 30, the right to vote. Prior to this, men not owning property and all women were denied the right to choose their local MP. This is therefore the first important step in granting women equality in terms of their access to democracy and is in no small part due to the efforts of the suffragette movement.

To celebrate this first step and the role of the suffragette movement, on Tuesday 6 February, all staff and students are invited to wear something purple, green or white, or ideally all three, which were the colours of the suffrage movement in addition to their normal uniform.

Additionally staff and students can make a donation toward Camfed (https://camfed. org/), a charity that aims to tackle poverty and inequality, particularly by supporting marginalised girls access to education.
