From the Headteacher

The experience helped them gain confidence in performing and in creating and organising an event. The children at pre-school were able to join in with playing percussion instruments and dancing and had an enjoyable time.


Thank you to Mr A Titley, Music Director who supported the group together with assistant Music Directors, 6th formers Callum Liddell and Georgia Beasley.
