About the course/workshop	First we will use the gel plate to make a series of prints from leaves, inspired by the colours and patterns of cyanotype printing. We will make enough prints for the books covers and to fill the insides pages of the book using mainly 'mask' printing and 'ghost' printing techniques. In the second part of the workshop we will make an A5 concertina book from scratch using two of the prints for the covers. We will then trim, cut and glue the other prints to fill the book. All the techniques are suitable for beginners so don't worry if you have never done any gel plate printing or bookmaking before – all techniques will be fully explained and demonstrated, and there will be lots of one to one help. Be warned though, gel plate printing is very addictive!	
What students should bring	Apron Gel plate (see important note below) Acrylic paint – suggest a few different colours of blue to follow the idea of cyanotype printing, but really any colours you like to work. The Pebeo and Hobbycraft brands work well and are a reasonable price. Paper - bring about 20 sheets of white printer weight paper A handful of leaves to print with – please bring fresh (not dried leaves) and nothing with thorns or spikes Roller (or brayer), or can be borrowed on the day Scissors Baby wipes Kitchen roll Basic drawing kit: pencil, eraser, sharpener Cutting tools: metal ruler, sharp craft knife, cutting mat Glue stick Two large heavy books for pressing your book

	Important note on gel plates:	
	If you have your own gel plate please bring it. If you don't have a gel plate then you can borrow one on the day.	
	If you want to buy one ahead of the workshop the two main brands that work well with acrylic paint are Gel Press and Gelli Arts. Please be aware that if you get a Speedball brand gel plate then these work best with Speedball inks rather than acrylics.	
	There will also be some gel plates available to purchase on the day, subject to availability. Please contact Janina in advance by email to reserve Janina.maher123@btinternet.com	
Materials for sale from tutor	There is a cover charge of £5 to cover other materials used on the day. This includes 140gsm and 220gsm cartridge paper, blue paper, scrap paper, grey board, and PVA glue.
