<b>About the course/workshop</b>	<p>Eat, drink, create! Make a tiny book of tea using actual teabags and inspiration from cakes, decorative china and the recipes and rituals that go with a nice cuppa! (coffee drinkers are also very welcome!)</p> <p>This workshop aims to use a range of mixed media to create a book full of ideas and techniques...perfect for our book of tea but adaptable to suit all sorts of themes. Have fun playing with a range of approaches in a relaxed &amp; informative way. No experience needed, lots of demos and step-by-step instruction</p>	
<b>What to bring</b>	<p>Reference to inspire you: pictures of mugs, jugs, teapots, cakes, scones, recipes etc (feel free to bring actual cakes!)</p> <p>Drawing pencil, scissors or craft knife, PVA or Matt medium</p> <p>Acrylic paints: process cyan, process magenta, process Yellow, titanium white (or whatever you have)</p> <p><b>OR</b></p> <p>Watercolours: pthalo blue, cadmium yellow light or lemon yellow, permanent rose, (or whatever you have) plus white gouache</p> <p>Used teabags (any sort inc. fruit teas), plus wrappers, tags etc if you have any</p> <p>Brushes (whatever you have)</p> <p>Mixing palette</p> <p>Paper: Scraps of paper for collage e.g book pages, old dress patterns, handmade papers (all in soft 'tea' colours – including fruit teas)</p> <p>Newspaper, kitchen roll, old clothes / apron</p>
