SHOES

Following changes to the school uniform from September 2016 students in Years 9-11 will be allowed to wear the old uniform until such time as they grow out of it when they will replace each item with the new version:

- Girls' summer shirts will no longer be permitted.
- When girls grow out of their crested jumper they will replace it with a crested blazer.
- Plain, navy v-necked jumpers are only to be worn under blazers, not instead of.
- Whilst they are still viable, girls may wear the old jumpers under blazers if they want.
