About the course/workshop	<p>Make your own shoal of sardines using simple linocutting techniques, fabric and clay! A fun workshop to explore the possibilities of creating embossed decorative surfaces to make a shoal of fish, ready to hang and show off your 'catch of the day'!</p> <p>If a softer version is more your thing you can use your lino stamp to print on fabric and make a collection of textile fish. We will finish the whole thing off by printing a label for your sardine tin to keep your collection in.</p> <p>A fun, creative day suitable for complete beginners and lovers of all things fishy! No experience necessary.....lots of step-by-step demos & individual help.</p>	
What to bring	<p>The tutor will bring white paper to share amongst the group but please bring any other papers you may wish to print on.</p> <p>Feel free to bring fabric to print on if you wish – the tutor will bring some plain calico. There will be a demo of sewing your fish, however due to time constraints you will probably need to do this at home.</p> <p>If you have your own lino-cutting tools & roller please feel free to bring them – the tutor will also bring some for use during the workshop.</p> <p>Kitchen roll, water pot, drawing pencil, rubber, Old clothes / apron, Small box to take your clay fish home in while they dry.</p>	
Materials for sale	<p>£8 materials charge payable on the day for papers, clay, fabric, tins, printing stuff, etc – please bring cash, the tutor doesn't have card facilities.</p>
