Preparing for Post 16

- 1. Each Year 11 student will receive a bespoke careers interview from Adviza who will discuss the different destination routes available and provide each student with an action plan. Each parent will receive a careers pack over the next couple of weeks and will have their child's action plan emailed home.
- 2. Each Year 11 student will receive an information, advice and guidance meeting with a member of the senior leadership team to discuss next steps and future destination plans.
- 3. Each Year 11 student will participate in a mock interview with an employer to experience the recruitment and selection process which will include preparing a CV and letter of application. This will take place on Tuesday 26 November.
