Year 10 Study and Exam Skills Day and Twilight Parents Session

On Thursday 19 March, an outside company called Positively MAD will be coming in to speak and educate our Year 10 students.

The sessions will be run throughout the school day and visiting presenters will run two sessions: Exam Busters and Study Skills. The aim of the sessions will be able to help prepare the students with revision techniques for their GSCE's next year.

The day will run in sync with the normal school day and lunch and break times will again be as normal. Students will need to make sure that on the day they have a notebook, and pens to write with during the session. They will also need to make sure that they pack the books and materials they will require for the lessons that they are attending on the day.
