- Prelims moved from June 2020 to week commencing Sept 14 2020.
- Prelims will be used to predict UCAS grades, but will not be the only data used. Classwork, homework and other assessments throughout the year will be used.
- Grades will be positive but realistic
- There will be another set of prelims, week commencing 11 Jan.

Home Study

- Students will need to apply for Home study which will be an option from November provided that: attendance, punctuality, deadlines are 'excellent' and they have completed the majority of their UCAS application including the personal statement.
- Attendance to the tutor session on a Friday morning is compulsory. Even if they do not have any lessons that day.
- If a Year 13 student has Home Study granted and a non-contact lesson at the start &/or the end of the day, they do not need to be in school until the first taught lesson or after the last lesson.
- If you would prefer that your son/daughter does not have home study please just let us know.
- Students are not guaranteed to be offered Home Study and it can be removed at anytime

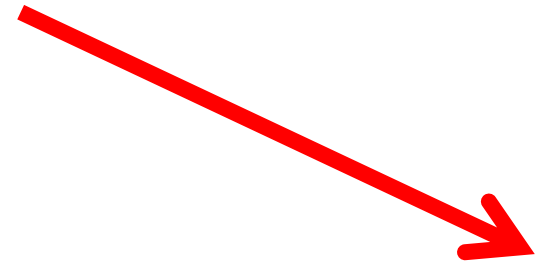



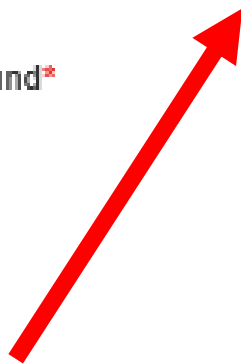
