Producing PPE for Frontline Workers

The Covid-19 has provided a number of challenges to our school community, however it has also provided us with the opportunity to come together and support each other in a number of community led incentives.

One such incentive was through a Leighton Park School initiative, to help the NHS by providing laser cut Face Shields for front line staff working in Hospitals and Nursing homes and for use by Care organisations.

The plea for help came about when Leighton Park were unable to fulfil the overwhelming demand from medical and health sectors. A number of schools spanning all the way from Tilehurst, Reading, Wokingham and Bracknell rushed to support them in the community's hour of need.

With the help of a TA member of staff to point us in the right direction, a Design Technology Technician and teacher, a Design Technology teacher at Maiden Erlegh in Reading and our headteachers Mr Paul Gibson and Mr Andy Johnson, the production of the parts for the face shields started.

Over 4 weeks during the lockdown and peak of the COVID-19 infection, just over 1000 Face Shields were created on the Design Technology Departments' Laser Cutters. Although Maiden Erlegh started production fairly late on, it was still a huge privilege to successfully contribute to the 32,000 face shields that were produced by the wider school community and a few local businesses.

A huge thank you goes to Mrs Vass for taking such good care of the sunflowers.



Ingredientes:
 1 taza (8 oz / 225 g) de agua
 1/2 taza (4 oz / 113 g) de mantequilla
 1 cucharadita de extracto de vainilla
 2 cucharaditas de azúcar moreno (balasa si no tienes marrón)
 1/2 cucharadita de sal
 1 taza (5 oz / 143 g) de harina normal / harina para todo uso
 3 huevos a temperatura ambiente
 1/2 taza (4 oz / 113g) de azúcar
 1 cucharadita de sal
 1 cucharadita de canela

Instrucciones:
 1. Precaliente el horno a 400 ° F (200 ° C). Coloque dos bandejas para hornear a un lado de la otra para hornear los churros. Unte las bandejas con delicado papel mantequilla. Unte de papel pergamino, dejar de lado.

In Music....

Students have been very busy working from home.

Students in Year 7 started off by making their own instruments.

We were very impressed with the imagination and creativity.

They created a variety of instruments and used lots of resources to make them. It was great to see that some of these instruments

were used to participate in the NHS Clap for Carers. We were also impressed with the family involvement on some of them.

They then looked at programme music and they created music

to represent a storm. Again, we were impressed with the creativity with cheese graters, whisks, milk and Lego being created to their music.



Year 8 started by looking at Samba music and they composed their own samba music using household objects like saucepans. Again, we were very impressed with the creativity and family involvement. They then looked at film music and listened to music from films to look at the effect the music has on the viewer. They also composed their own leitmotifs to represent a character in a film.

Year 9 have been looking at music from around the world. They have looked at Bhangra music, samba music, African music and folk music. They have composed and performed music in these styles. They have then gone onto look at the elements of music in relation to the GCSE set works and completed a composing task based on Star Wars. We have been very impressed with their commitment and involvement on zoom lessons. They have also been working on developing their solo performance skills.

Year 10 have been continuing with their study of the GCSE set works, including Beethoven's Pathetique Sonata and Defying Gravity from Wicked. We have been extremely impressed with their commitment to the zoom lessons and we regularly have 95-100% attendance on their lessons. They have also been working on developing their solo performance skills.

Careers, Work Experience, Work Related Learning and STEAM Provision:

As we approach the end of the academic year, we want to share with you the wide variety of opportunities students have had available to them as part of our careers, work experience, work-related and STEAM learning programme at Maiden Erlegh School. Despite school closure since March, we have still offered the following provision:

Year 9 Virtual Careers Inspiration Day

On Friday 19 June students in Year 9 participated in our first virtual careers day. This event was designed to provide students with a valuable insight into a range of careers within different sectors and industries and to support students in considering and planning for their next steps, in particular the Year 10 Work Shadow Day and the Year 11 Mock Interview Day. Through information and interactive taster sessions, the event provided students with the opportunity to immerse themselves in six different career sectors; Public Sector, Creative Arts and Design, Science and Technology, Leisure, Sport, and Tourism, Accountancy, Banking, and Finance and Construction and Trades. Students produced some really creative work and Mr Gibson, Headteacher, will be announcing the winners in due course.

Year 12 Virtual Work Experience

Our expectation is that students complete 30 hours of work experience that is directly related to their chosen career path in either Year 12 or 13. Year 12 students have been taking advantage of the huge number of virtual work experience placements that are currently being offered in place of the normal face-to-face experience. We would recommend that students continue to apply for these virtual placements as we know that universities and apprenticeship providers are increasingly expecting students to have gained first-hand exposure of the workplace, either physically or remotely and this will provide students with concrete examples to make reference to in future personal statements and job applications. Placements are currently on offer from a wide variety of organisations including Spotify, Ofcom, Barclays Bank, KPMG, Law firms, Brighton and Sussex Medical School, Cisco, BP and Marie Curie.

Year 7 Virtual STEAM Day

On Monday 13 July students in Year 7 participated in a virtual STEAM day. The day had been designed to provide students with the opportunity to immerse themselves in the five STEAM subjects (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, Maths) through interactive and informative activities. The day began with an introductory film from the STEAM subject Careers Ambassadors explaining the variety of ways in which students can pursue their subjects at GCSE, A-Level, apprenticeship, and degree level. Our Ambassadors also provided students with an invaluable insight into the importance of the STEAM subjects in developing essential skills for the 21st century and the range of career opportunities available within STEAM industries. We were fortunate enough to secure the involvement of an industry expert from each STEAM industry to provide a window into their careers and working life, whilst offering advice and guidance to our students about how to be successful in STEAM subjects both at school and in their future careers. Students then chose one of the STEAM subjects to focus on and complete a creative project in. The activity options provided students with an engaging challenge relevant to the STEAM subject they had chosen and were designed to be flexible, open-ended, and involve as minimal materials as possible, whilst at the same time reflecting real projects a STEAM professional may be asked to complete during their career.

Kooth provides a safe, secure means of accessing help via the internet. By accessing Kooth, students can benefit from:

- ⇒ **A free, confidential, anonymous and safe** way to receive support online.
- ⇒ **Out of hours' availability.** Counsellors are available from 12noon to 10pm on weekdays and 6pm to 10pm at weekends, every day of the year on a drop in basis.
- ⇒ **Online Counselling** from a professional team of BACP qualified counsellors is available via 1-1 chat sessions or messaging on a drop in basis or via booked sessions.
- ⇒ **Discussion Boards, which are all pre-moderated,** allow young people to access peer-to-peer support.
- ⇒ **Online Magazine** full of moderated articles many of which are submitted by young people offering advice and guidance on a huge range of topics.
