## Dear Parent/Guardian

## Year 8 into Year 9 - Autumn 2021 Term - Tutor Reading Programme

You may remember that when your son or daughter was in Year 7, we launched a tutor reading programme. Unfortunately, due to Covid-19 restrictions and associated risk assessments, we had to suspend the programme temporarily. I am pleased to tell you that we are in a position to re-launch the scheme in September with a new selection of amazing reads.

As a reminder, our tutor group reading programme is designed to:

- Instil a love of reading and a love of literature in our students
- Model fluent reading for students
- Expose students to new and diverse texts and ideas
- Develop the cultural capital of our students beyond their existing realm of experience
- Provide opportunities for students to share in the experience of reading for pleasure beyond the classroom

Approximately every half term, students will be asked to read a set text alongside other members of their tutor group.

We continue to advocate 20 minutes of reading *every* day for *every* student and do ask for your support with this. However, we will also be offering the following opportunities during the school day:

- Weekly tutor session dedicated to reading. The tutor will read aloud from a designated chapter. Chapters to be focused on will be shared with students in advance to act as mini reading deadlines to help them stay on track.
- Regular reading time within English lessons where students can continue to read their tutor reading programme book or a book of their own choice.
- DEAR lessons where the school 'Drops Everything And Reads' on a rotational basis.
- A tutor session per half term where the tutor will facilitate discussion, encourage students to share ideas about what they have read and ask questions of the text and/or each other.

The texts have been pre-selected in liaison with our English department to ensure that they cover a range of age-appropriate genres and interest levels. Occasionally, texts may touch upon more sensitive issues (for example, relationships or bereavement) but nothing that is not in line with relevant PSMSC objectives. If your child is uncomfortable reading a particular text or section of text, they should speak with their form tutor or Head of Year who will be able to support them as appropriate. This programme is designed to promote the enjoyment of reading and students will not be formally assessed through the scheme.

We obviously recognise that many of our students are keen readers who are comfortable in making their own independent reading choices and are already reading in excess of one book per half term. The introduction of the tutor reading programme is to ensure that all students are reading and engaging with the material outside of lessons and we would still encourage keen readers to seek advice about more challenging reads and to pursue their own reading preferences in addition to this minimum requirement.

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You may have already made a contribution towards funding this scheme and if so, we are not asking for any further payments at this time. If you did not contribute initially then a suggested payment of £10 has been set up for you on Parent Pay. Students are responsible for taking care of the books they are given and we will be asking for a further contribution should books get lost or damaged beyond what we consider to be reasonable wear and tear. The books that have been chosen for this year group are listed below:
