Physical Abuse





This would happen, for instance, when a child is all the time being unfairly blamed for everything, or told they are stupid and made to feel unhappy.

When an adult deliberately hurts a child, such as hitting, shaking, throwing, poisoning, burning, drowning or suffocating





Neglect





An example would be where a child has been forced to take part in sexual activities or in the taking of rude photos.

When a child is not being looked after properly, not getting enough to eat or being left alone in dangerous situations.

Peer on Peer Abuse

Any form of physical, emotional, sexual harm between peers. For example,

- Teasing
- Bullying
- Not just 'banter', 'having a laugh'
- Unwanted touching
- Harmful Sexual Behaviour (parties, parks, with alcohol and drugs, anywhere...!)
- ... etc.

We need to know!



A few facts about the law...



The age of consent (the legal age when two people can engage in sexual activity)



The age of criminal responsibility. If you break the law, you can be arrested and taken to court.



What do we do?



- We listen to you when you want to talk about something is worrying you
- It might be about you or a friend
- We might choose to speak to a parent or get extra help from outside of school
- Support you to be happy and safe



Keeping you safe in school

- All adults and sixth formers wear lanyards
- Challenge or speak to a teacher if you see anyone without one
- You are not allowed to leave the school site at any time during the school day





It is one we need to be open and honest about, so we can put the right support in place

All of the teachers here at Maiden Erlegh have been trained to listen, if you need to talk

They can't keep what you say a secret, they can ensure you get help

Taught Curriculum: entry requirements

- Minimum of 5 GCSEs or their equivalent at Grade 5 or/and Merit (Level 2 BTEC or similar vocational)
- 2. If these five subjects do not include either GCSE English or GCSE mathematics, students must achieve a grade 4 in these.
- 3. Some subjects require a (5/7) grade to study at A Level.

- Pathway 1: Five Grade 5's or higher
- 3 A levels or applied general courses in Yr 12 &13
- Work experience

- Pathway 2: Five Grade 5's including English with maths at grade 7 or higher
