#### Senior Maths Challenge

On Wednesday 10 November, thirty students from years 12 and 13 took part in the Senior Mathematical Challenge, a national competition run by the UK Mathematics Trust. Students faced twenty-five increasingly challenging questions for which they had an hour and a half to pick the correct answers without the benefit of a calculator, with the added pressure of negative marks for wrong answers!

I am delighted to say that we had 27 students achieving a bronze, silver or gold certificate (including 5 golds), and a would like to make a special mention of George C who scored a remarkable 117 out of a maximum 125 and qualified for round 1 of the British Mathematical Olympiad. Well done to all who participated.





Students who do not engage with the opportunity will be expected in school to follow a timetable of core lessons.

#### Year 12 and Year 13 Work

#### **Experience**

We have launched work experience to students in Year 12 (and relaunched it to Year 13) as part of the 16-19 study programme. All students are expected to complete a 30 hour work experience placement which is directly linked to their chosen career aspiration. Students are to actively seek their own work experience placement by researching and contacting potential companies, going through the recruitment process e.g. completing application forms, CVs, interviews, and completing a suitable placement. Students should also be actively applying to the wide range of virtual work experience placements that companies are currently offering, which are shared with students on a daily basis.





#### 'Show and Tell' The Photography Movement

Year 10 Photography students have had an amazing opportunity to participate in a National project called, Show and Tell, which teaches the positive link between photography and mental health. They were invited to respond to a workshop on documenting Sport by professional photographer Jane Stockdale and then submit their photographs along with many other schools across the country. We are so proud to have 3 of our students' work selected by Jane and these students have had their work celebrated in a live feedback session where she discussed 25 chosen images from schools and youth clubs in the UK. As you can see here, the standard was very strong and our students have shown tremendous skill in capturing movement in striking and dynamic compositions.

# Year 13 Art and Photography trip to London: The Saatchi Gallery and Tate Modern

Starting at The Saatchi Gallery, students saw the work of JR, a French 'photograffeur' who exhibits his work free of charge on the walls of the whole world – attracting the attention of those who do not usually go to museums. A brisk walk across London, past Westminster and Southbank, allowed students to gather images while on route to Tate Modern where they ended the day visiting as many exhibitions time would allow.

Simeon, one of our double endorsement Art and Photography students has written of the experience;

The Saatchi Gallery's Exhibition was the largest collection of the French photographer JR (Jean Rean), showing a detailed and thorough look into 15 years of his work, with films, contacts sheets, photographs and process shots, showing the whole process and ideology of his work.

From his earlier graffiti work, to finding his first camera on a train station and his large experimentation with scale and size. One of the most interesting parts of the exhibition was Tehachapi (2019) which showed his photographs with the inmates of a high-security prison in California. Throughout his work he tackles many major global issues and problems from immigration, gun control and corruption, leading to create giant scale installations in extremely public spaces to help push the issues to the forefront of society. Throughout his career, JR has travelled all the world, photographing portraits of the people he meets, creating a chronological timeline of his travels around the Middle East.

An immense advantage of having a day in London dedicated for photography and art, is that due to the plethora of infrastructure and a strong diversity of architectural styles found in London, the sheer amount of areas of interest to photograph was immense, allowing for a collection of extremely varied images. This is evident with areas such as, Leake Street Arches, South Bank, Westminster Bridge and Victoria St. This allowed for large experimentation with buildings, crowds of people and landmarks. The pace and movement of the trip also helped to keep moving forward with newer landmarks and ideas, not just sticking to one area. Due to the large amount of high rise skyscrapers in London, experimenting with perspective was encouraged helping to create images that used elements unseen in Reading.


