



Consultation on proposed Admission Arrangements for Maiden Erlegh School for entry from September 2019

Introduction

Maiden Erlegh School is an academy school and is its own admission authority, forming part of the Maiden Erlegh Trust. When an admission authority wishes to make changes to their admission arrangements they must consult to ensure all views are heard. Maiden Erlegh Trust is consulting on the following changes to the admission arrangements for Maiden Erlegh School:

Proposed change to the existing oversubscription criteria regarding children of staff.

The Admission Arrangements for 2018/19 are as follows:

The children of staff at Maiden Erlegh School where that member of staff is the legal parent and guardian of that child, has a permanent contract to work at the school and where that member of staff has been employed at the school for 2 or more years at the time of application for the place or the member of staff is recruited to fill a vacant post within a demonstrable skill shortage

The **proposed** Admission Arrangements for 2019/20 are:

The children of staff at Maiden Erlegh Trust whose main place of work is Maiden Erlegh School at the time of the closing date for applications, where that member of staff is the legal parent or guardian of that child, has a permanent contract to work at the school and where that member of staff has been employed at the school for 2 or more consecutive years at the time of the closing date for applications or the member of staff is recruited to fill a post for which there is a demonstrable skill shortage. The skills shortage area will be determined by the Maiden Erlegh Academy Trust by 1 July of the year of application and made available on the school website.
