## **First Day Start Times**

Students will have a break at 11.00 and then their first lesson (Period 3) will start at 11.15am.

## **School Uniform**

All students are required to wear full school uniform every day. Students will change into their PE kit at the start of their practical PE lessons and **should not** wear their kit to school. Full school uniform should be accompanied by black polishable shoes, with no logos, unless the student has a formal medical condition, with evidence supplied, in advance, to their Head of Year. One trend that has creeped in this year is the wearing of tracksuit tops and hoodies as coats, these are not acceptable and will be confiscated for pick up at the end of the day. If an additional item to the school uniform is required, please ensure this is a normal coat. Shirts should be tucked in at all times. Please see communication from Miss Cheshire regarding the sixth form dress code.

## **Equipment for Learning (Y7-11)**

All students are expected to have their own equipment for learning. All students are expected to have the equipment listed below contained within a <u>transparent pencil case</u>. This pencil case allows tutors to check the equipment of students quickly and easily. We appreciate that students may not be able to fit a scientific calculator and maths set in their transparent pencil cases and so we are happy for these to be carried separately in their school bags.

- Pens black/blue, green and red
- Writing pencils
- Coloured pencils
- Rubber
- Pencil sharpener
- Glue stick
- 30cm ruler
- Maths set (containing protractor, compass, set square)
- Scientific calculator we recommend a Casio calculator FX-83GTX or FX-85GTX, however most scientific calculators are fine.
- At least 2 highlighters
- Transparent pencil case

We recognise that some families may at this time be experiencing financial hardship, if this is the case or you are in receipt of Pupil Premium funding, then please contact the relevant Head of Year, if you require additional support.

Students are required to have a reading book, in their bag at all times.
