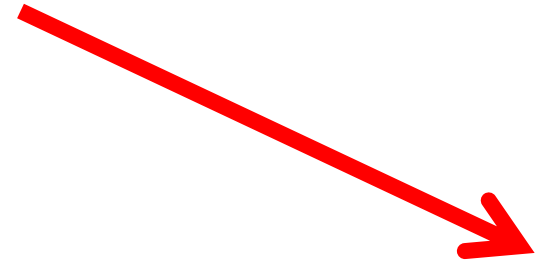

- Checks application and personal statement

- Sends application to universities

- Starts UCAS track

- Feeds offers back to students

- Sends responses to Universities

- Sends Results to Universities

- Confirmation and clearing

Application process

Admissions tutors consider:

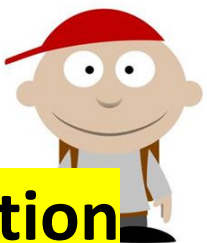

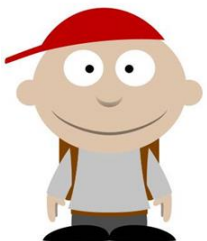


