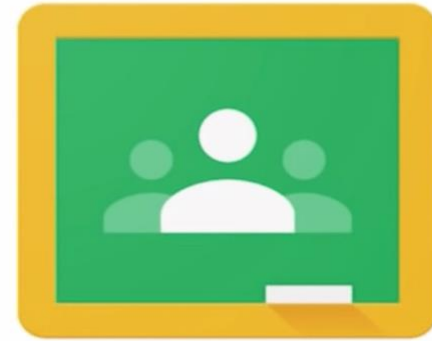

Taught Curriculum: entry requirements

1. Minimum of 5 GCSEs or their equivalent at Grade 5 or/and Merit (Level 2 BTEC or similar vocational)
2. If these five subjects do not include either GCSE English or GCSE mathematics, students must achieve a grade 4 in these.
3. Some subjects require a (5/7) grade to study at A Level.

- 3 A levels or applied general courses in Yr 12 & 13

- Pathway 2: Five Grade 5's including English with maths at grade 7 or higher

High Expectations

- . 33% of grades were A*/A – up 12% on 2019 (better than TAGs)
- . 63% of grades were A*-B – up 15% on 2019 (better than TAGs)
- . 85% of grades were A*-C – up 14% on 2019 (better than TAGs and 2022!)
- . 99% of grades were A*-E – up 1% on 2019
- . Made the top 250 in Times Parent Power
- . No gender gap!
