



Work experience

- All Year 10 students will participate in a structured week of work experience in the summer term.
- Students will have the opportunity to observe, listen, ask questions and experience a real working environment.
- The experience is linked to previous Careers Education learning e.g., Year 9 Careers Inspiration Day.
- As part of Personal Development lessons, Year 10 will follow specific Careers Education learning in preparation for the week e.g., dress to impress.



Work experience

- A meaningful placement provides an opportunity to spend a period of time outside of the classroom, learning about a particular job, sector or industry first hand.
- Work experience can help students to decide upon appropriate options, destinations and pathways post-16.
- Students will get the chance to develop key transferable employability skills such as communication, independence and self-confidence.



The Benefits

Helps with post-16 decisions

Personal reward e.g. more confidence Develop technical skills e.g. knowledge Future opportunities e.g. internships, discover other routes into jobs

Work Experience Options

Route One – Own Placement

- We encourage students to find their **own placement** -especially if the student/family has contacts who can help.
- An Own Placement form needs to be completed and sent into School
- EBP will carry out pre-placement checks



Route One: Finding an Own Placement

Who could provide a work experience placement?



- Employers must have full Employer Liability Insurance cover-exception is when working with a close family member and company is nonlimited.
- Placements outside of Berkshire and Oxfordshire may incur charges-we can check what these may be.
- Student and Employer complete and sign an Own Placement Form which is returned to school - student MUST also complete a general application form



Work Experience Options

Route Two - EBP Sourced placement

- EBP will **source a placement** for the student
- Student and parent/guardian must complete and sign general
 Application Form which is returned to school
- EBP will carry out pre-placement checks



Route 2: EBP Sourced Placements

- The students complete an Application Form using the Student Guide to assist
 - Include interests
 - Three general sectors interested in
 - Locations / where they can get to and how
 - Medical information

Be realistic, think of types of employers in the area



EBP Placement process continued

 Parental/Guardian signatures are required before EBP can start work on the application.

Return completed form to school as soon as possible-latest 24th
 November.

EBP may need to interview some students for individual placing

Once a placement has been confirmed-any changes will incur a charge



Pre- Placement Checks

Checking that the setting is appropriate and safe for the student

Insurance – EBP check Employer Liability Insurance is held

Employers asked to undertake a Risk Assessment





Please bear in mind these are changing times

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic there may be changes or restrictions on work experience placements, including...

- Reduced placement opportunities
- Changing circumstances
- Placement may be cancelled by either party
- Hybrid working





Reflections from last year

- Some sector requests were far too specific
- Some sectors do not take under 16s on Work experience, for example:
 - Civilian Forces, i.e., Police, Ambulance, Fire Service
- Hospitals will run their own work experience programmes, aimed at over 16s
- Certain sectors are difficult to source, particularly:
 - Veterinary surgeons,
 - Journalism
 - Theatre
 - Architecture
 - Web design
 - Printing/graphics
 - Beauty
 - Warehouses
- Lots of places available within primary school settings and childcare



Choosing sectors

Try not to be too specific

OCCUPATIONAL AREA	COMMENTS - please read these carefully
Animals (horses, dogs, cats), farms, gardening/horticulture, golf courses, garden centre	For these you must be prepared to travel, public transport will be limited, you will need to walk/cycle or go by car
Estate agents, finance, general office/admin, travel agency	May be general use of computers in an office.
Building trades, car related e.g. carpenters, site maintenance, body shop, mechanics	Safety boots will be required for these placements which you will need to provide
Hotels, catering to include restaurants/cafes/fast food	These may involve shift work e.g. 12pm-8pm
Day centres, day nurseries, playgroups, schools - primary & secondary, special needs, church, dentist	For secondary school please detail which subject(s) you are interested in e.g. sport, drama, art etc.
Retail - books, clothes, department stores, florist, opticians, supermarket, hairdressers, library, stationery, charity shop	It is important to say which type of shop you are interested in and why
