## Year 10 Silver Duke of Edinburgh Award (DofE)

I am delighted to announce we still have some places available on the Silver Duke of Edinburgh Award for this year.

The DofE Award is a well-established and world-renowned extracurricular programme, designed to help young people develop new skills, volunteer to help their community, improve their levels of fitness and provide them with opportunities that build their character, confidence and competence. The award requires students to complete the four sections: Physical, Volunteering, Skills and Expedition. This is a brilliant opportunity for our students to gain valuable new experiences and a skillset that will help them to develop as well-rounded, confident individuals and to help them appeal to future employers. This will build upon skills required for the workplace which they have explored in Personal Development in the Year 9 Careers' topic.

Please note that students <u>do not</u> need to have completed the Bronze Duke of Edinburgh Award to sign up for the Silver Award. Students who have completed the Bronze are welcome to apply in order to progress into and achieve the Silver Award. Last year's Year 9 students felt they gained new skills and experience from the Bronze Award which has impacted all aspects of their lives in a positive way.

We are very thrilled as a school to be offering this opportunity as there are few schools in the area which run DofE and the award is prestigious and highly regarded by employers.

Student's participating in the DofE Silver Award will be expected to meet after school from 3:00pm – 4:00pm every Thursday, commencing Thursday 14 December. These sessions will help to prepare students for their expedition and teach them the skills they need to excel in their DofE journey. Once signed up, students will have access to an eDofE account which logs their progress through the award online and allows their assessors for each section to upload a report.

The expedition section will be run via the school while the other three sections are for students to complete independently. The practice expedition will run from Friday 28 June to Sunday 30 June 2024 in the Surrey Hills. The qualifying expedition will take place from Friday 20 September to Sunday 22 September 2024 in the New Forest. For both expeditions, students will be walking for at least four hours a day and camping in two or three person tents in the countryside with basic facilities. They must hike with all their equipment for the weekend and complete a small project as part of the expedition which can be chosen by the group. The Duke of Edinburgh Award is inclusive and recognises not all students are able to meet these demands, therefore, expeditions can be adapted to the individuals needs allowing all students the opportunity to take part and gain the award. Please ensure before enrolling that your child is available for both the practice and final expedition as there will not be another opportunity during the year. Please note, students will be out of lessons all day Friday for both expeditions, and it is their responsibility to catch up on any missed school work. It is likely that parents/guardians will need to collect students for the practice expedition. Transport for both expeditions is via coach and is included in the cost for the trip.

During the second and third day of the practice expedition and the whole final expedition, your son/daughter will be remotely supervised by the accompanying staff. We will issue them with a mobile phone number, a map, a compass and a route with instructions designed by the students themselves. Each group will have a tracker which allows staff to monitor progress and ensure the safety of students while they are remotely supervised. The students will meet up at the campsite/destination for a final register before parent or carer collection.

The cost to formally enrol your son/daughter to participate in the Duke of Edinburgh Award will be approximately £205.00. This is subject to change depending on final booking costs. This price includes participation fees, expedition fees and a welcome pack that will be sent to you via post, also accompanied with a DofE discount card offering 10% off all purchases at Millets, Blacks and Go Outdoors. The cost will be split into two payments. The first non-refundable payment of £25.50 will be required within two weeks of your son/daughter acquiring a place on the award which covers enrolment and participation fees. The second payment of approximately £179.50 will cover both the practice and final expedition of a 2 night and 3-day adventure and will be due in the Spring term, 2023. If your child is eligible for Pupil Premium funding, you can request a contribution towards the enrolment and expedition costs via MESDofE@maidenerleghtrust.org.

If your child is unable to attend this trip due illness or to Covid-19 isolation, unfortunately we are unable to guarantee a refund, however we will endeavour to offer a full/partial refund if;

- Another student replaces your child's place on the trip
- The school is able to agree a full/partial refund from external agencies with whom the trip is booked

We will be asking for students to purchase personal kit for the expedition, i.e. backpack, sleeping bags, roll mats, shoes, clothing, appropriate food and drink. Tents and cooking equipment will be provided for students. Should you be entitled to Pupil Premium funding, there will be limited kit available to hire should this be needed. Please discuss this with your child's group leader once allocated. A full kit list required for the DofE expedition can be found here.

Due to limited equipment and safety of the students on expeditions, we only have 27 places left on the award. Please complete the expression of interest google form attached <a href="here">here</a> to register your son/daughter for a place on the award by 8am on Friday 8 December. Selection of students will be random if places are oversubscribed.

Please note that representing the school on a trip, fixture or at an event is a privilege and we reserve the right to withdraw that privilege for students who are persistently late to school or lessons, do not follow our uniform or behaviour policies or bring the school into disrepute in any way.
