Our impressive progress 8 score of 1.09 is a testament to our school community and the effort our students have invested. This score means that, on average, students at this school will achieve over a grade higher than a student with the same Key Stage 2 scores at an average school. I am immensely proud that this phenomenal score propels our school into the top 50 schools in England for progress including selective schools!

The annual Winter Showcase really does highlight more of our students' talents. I was privileged enough to have front row seats at this years' performance, and I was not disappointed. A huge well done to all the students who took part in this extremely successful event. Speaking of winter celebrations, the brilliant Christmas decoration competition winner is displayed at the end of this letter. Congratulations to Yonili in Year 7 for creating this lovely decoration, which currently holds pride of place on our Christmas tree in the reception area.

The PE department are buzzing with a number of sporting successes under their belts this term. Notably, our U13 girls football team, taking the title at the Berkshire 5-a-side Football Festival, while the U12 girls team secured an impressive 3rd place in the Reading Schools 5-a-side competition. The Year 7 boys football team clinched the Reading Schools 5-a-side plate, adding to the success of the Year 7 boys rugby team as Reading Schools league finalists. The U14 boys basketball team are District League champions and the Year 8 girls netball team performed amazingly, gaining 4th place at the Southeast Berkshire Netball Tournament. Congratulations to all the students who took part in these events, I am truly impressed at their sporting prowess #TeamMaidenErlegh.

Inclusion Staffing Structure

As we enter a new term on Tuesday 2 January, I would like to focus on a few reminders on our return.

• School Uniform

All students are required to wear full school uniform every day; this includes the school tie for their year group. Full school uniform should be accompanied by black polishable shoes, with no logos, unless the student has a formal medical condition, with evidence written supplied, in advance, to their Head of Year. Tracksuit tops and hoodies as coats are not acceptable and will be confiscated for pick up at the end of the day, if worn on the school site. If an additional item to the school uniform is required, please ensure this is a normal coat. Shirts should be tucked in at all times. Wearing the correct school uniform is not just a dress code – it fosters a professional atmosphere and creates a sense of pride in our students. • Equipment for Learning

Another very important ingredient in the recipe for success is having a well-equipped pencil case. Having the correct equipment for lessons ensures that students are ready to participate in lessons immediately, which means lesson time can be for teaching and learning. We appreciate that students may not be able to fit a scientific calculator and maths set in their transparent pencil cases and so we are happy for these to be carried separately in their school bags.

- 30cm ruler
- Maths set (containing protractor, compass, set square)
- Scientific calculator we recommend a Casio calculator FX-83GTX or FX-85GTX,
 - however most scientific calculators are fine
- At least 2 highlighters
- Transparent pencil case
