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Year 11 & Post-16 Careers Education

Attendance	Effect on Results (per GCSE or equivalent)
96 – 100%	+1.4
92 – 95.9%	-0.7
90 – 91.9%	-1.5
85 – 89.9%	-1.9
80 – 84.9%	-2.7
0 – 79.9%	-3.3

95%	=	47 LESSONS MISSED EACH YEAR 8 days in total or 1 week and 3 days
90%	=	95 LESSONS MISSED EACH YEAR 16 days in total or 3 weeks and 1 day
85%	=	142 LESSONS MISSED EACH YEAR 24 days in total or 4 weeks and 4 days
80%	=	190 LESSONS MISSED EACH YEAR 32 days in total or 6 weeks and 2 days

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Entry Requirements

1. Minimum of 5 GCSEs or their equivalent at Grade 5 or/and Merit (Level 2 BTEC or similar vocational)
2. If these five subjects do not include either GCSE English and GCSE mathematics, students must achieve a grade 4 in these.
3. Some subjects require a grade 5, 6 or 7 at GCSE to study at A Level.
