Year 12 – Gold Duke of Edinburgh 2026

We are excited to announce the launch of the Gold Duke of Edinburgh Award for Year 12 students.

The Gold DofE Award offers a unique opportunity to develop a wide range of valuable skills, including teamwork, confidence, independence, and employability. Like the Bronze and Silver levels, students will complete sections in volunteering, physical activity, skills development, and an expedition. In addition, the Gold Award includes a *residential section*, where students spend five days and four nights participating in an activity with others they haven't met before. This experience is designed to promote personal growth, encourage new challenges, and build lasting memories. It's an excellent way to enhance CVs and strengthen university applications, all while fostering independence and trying something new.

Students do not need to have finished Bronze or Silver DofE to complete Gold, however, if students have completed all sections of Silver DofE, then the timescales for the volunteering, skills and physical are reduced. We will run three sessions after school on Wednesdays during November to support students choosing sections, setting up the eDofE app and getting started on the award. These will commence on **Wednesday 5 November** and further details will be shared once the expression of interest deadline has passed.

Expedition Details

We are using an Approved Activity Provider, School of Outdoors, to run the expedition section. They will run three training events and the qualifying expedition. There will be a parent information session on which will be run by DofE and School of Outdoors which will cover information on each of the sections, eDofE app, expedition and training.

Students must attend all training events run by School of Outdoors to be able to complete the qualifying expedition. If a student is unable to make a training date or expedition, School of Outdoors will try to offer another opportunity to complete the event with another school.

Travel costs are not included within the cost and students must ensure they plan the journey to and from the training and expeditions in advance.



Please note that Maiden Erlegh School staff will not be present on the training dates or expeditions below and are only acting as the payment agent for the expedition section. All School of Outdoors staff have appropriate qualifications and DBS checks. School of Outdoors are fully responsible for students while on the training and expeditions and will use their own emergency contact system. All queries and concerns should be directed to School of Outdoors.

To set up a student account with School of Outdoors, we will share relevant personal information.

- Training Day – Thursday 22 January 2026 – in school
- Training Day – Saturday 14 March 2026 – Chiltern Hills, near Watlington
- Practice expedition – Saturday 23 May – Monday 25 May 2026 – Brecon Beacons, Wales
- Qualifying expedition – Thursday 27 August – Monday 31 August 2026 – Elan Valley, Wales

Personal Kit

Students will be required to take and wear adequate equipment, clothing and footwear. Students must obtain personal kit for the expedition, including a backpack, sleeping bag, roll mat, shoes, clothing, appropriate food and drink. Tents, cooking equipment, fuel, maps, compasses, map cases and group first aid kits will be provided for students by School of Outdoors. DofE recommends the following [kit list](#) as a rough guide to what students are expected to bring. Should you be entitled to Pupil Premium funding, there will be limited kit available to hire should this be needed. Please discuss this with your child's group leader.

Payments

Parent Agreement

I have read the information letter regarding the above-named trip and agree to my child participating.

I understand that I am responsible for ensuring:

- That my child arrives for departure on time and for making arrangements for them to get home on our return.
- **Staff have up to date and accurate contact and medical details at the time of departure, and all relevant medication. Please email office@maidenerleghschool.co.uk if your child's medical information has changed. Medical information must also be shared with School of Outdoors**
- My child has appropriate clothing, equipment, food and drink for the trip.
- I understand that if my child is unable to attend the trip, I may not receive a refund of monies paid.
- That there will be periods when my child is under remote supervision



I also understand that it is my child's responsibility to make up for any missed class or homework and to do so at an appropriate standard. I will support them to do this.

If your child requires any medication e.g. an inhaler this must be brought on the trip or your child will not be allowed on the trip.

Should your child's medical circumstances change, it is your duty to inform the school and School of Outdoors in writing as soon as possible and before the day of departure.

During this trip the accompanying staff from School of Outdoors will be available at all times but there will be substantial periods of remote supervision when students will be hiking in groups of between 4 and 7. Remote supervision is when the group is monitored by staff from a distance, but they are not directly with the group. Students will have a GPS tracker which can call for staff in an emergency.

This trip will likely clash with the year 12 diving trip to Malta during May half term. We suggest students only commit to one of the two trips.

Please note that representing the school on a trip, fixture or at an event is a privilege and we reserve the right to withdraw that privilege for students who are persistently late to school or lessons, do not follow our uniform or behaviour policies or bring the school into disrepute in any way.
