Year 13 – Exam Study Support Programme

I am writing to update you on the arrangements for Year 13 students last day as well as revision conferences that have been organised to support students ahead of their examinations.

Final Day & Study Leave

Year 13's final day will be Friday 1 May. Students will be expected to attend lessons 1 to 4 as normal, with a celebratory assembly being held in period 5. Students do not need to wear uniform on this day but can come to school in smart casual wear. Students will be expected to wear their yellow lanyards as part of our safeguarding policy. Normal behaviour expectations will apply.

Study leave will commence from Tuesday 5 May. Students can, if they wish, come to school and speak to teachers during their usual timetabled lessons. If they choose to do so, they should use their ID cards to sign in and sign out using the InVentry scanners as part of our safeguarding policies. They will also be expected to adhere to uniform policies and wear appropriate uniform.

Revision Seminars

From Tuesday 5 May to Friday 8 May a series of revision conferences will be held for students. Attendance is compulsory. These revision sessions have been designed to provide exam practice for paper 1 and paper 2 in the relevant subjects and consolidate subject knowledge. Revision conferences for paper 3 in the relevant subjects will be held on Friday 15 May, Friday 22 May, Friday 5 June and Monday 8 June. A link to the revision conferences can be found [here](#).
