Dear Parent/Guardian

Firstly, I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate our Year 12 students on their hard work, commitment, and achievements throughout their first year in the Sixth Form.

Students have adapted well to the demands of advanced level study, embraced new responsibilities, and made valuable contributions to our wider school community.

I am particularly delighted to recognise those students – 96 in total, who have demonstrated exceptional commitment beyond the classroom by successfully completing 30 hours of Community Service and the many who have undertaken a work experience placement. A number of students have also been awarded prizes in recognition of their academic excellence and of course we leave the year with a new student senior team.

Whilst there is much to celebrate, the Year 12 Prelim examinations have also provided an important indication of the work that remains before students begin Year 13. For some students, the results demonstrated that they are not yet where they need to be academically to achieve their full potential in their final examinations next year.

It is therefore essential that all students, particularly those whose Prelim results were below expectations, use the summer break productively to ensure they are Year 13 ready. We strongly encourage students to:

- Complete past examination questions and papers in each subject.
- Review feedback from teachers and address any gaps in knowledge or understanding.
- Consolidate key content from Year 12 to ensure a secure foundation for Year 13 learning.
- Organise folders, notes and revision materials so that resources are complete and easily accessible
- Get ahead with reading for Non Examined Assessments (NEAs). Please note departments will send out individual letters about NEAS, in the new academic year.
