What is life like as a Buddhist today? Our Year 8s have been finding out.....

Today we had exciting visitors called Kelsang Ningpo, who is a Buddhist nun and Bill Cosgrove who is a lay Buddhist from the Kadampa Meditation Centre in Reading. It was so interesting and enjoyable to find out about them and what their lives are like being a Buddhist in 2018.

First, we meditated together on the floor and it felt a bit odd because we were not used to it but it was very peaceful. It cleared our minds of our troubles while we focussed on the breath.

Then we were given a chance to ask our own questions. We asked them about their views of rebirth, meditation and to explain some of the Buddha's key teachings (of which she told us there are 84,000!). We learnt that they believe that the mind is the source of both suffering and happiness, and that their main goal is to achieve enlightenment so that there can be complete inner peace.

Sydney Sussex College

On Wednesday 6 June, 25 Gold Programme students were selected to go on a trip to Sydney Sussex College, part of Cambridge University, with 11 other students from Chiltern Edge School.

Sydney Sussex College is just one of 29 colleges making up Cambridge University and was built in 1596 making it one of the oldest colleges to be part of Cambridge University.

Our first talk was by Katie Vickers (the admissions officer), a presentation telling us about what it is like to live the Cambridge life and how to get there. A Q&A with 3 Cambridge students gave us good insight into life at university. We found out many things, such as how to manage time at university, the transition of school to university and how to manage the increase in independent learning. Then they gave us a tour of the college showing us the accommodation services and places to eat. After having an extra ravenous lunch, we were fuelled to listen to a very interesting and learning enhancing speech on the Black Death. It showed us how cross-curricular many subjects are due to the fact you can look at similar themes with from many different angles. Furthermore, it awarded us a valuable insight telling us how to develop theories from different angles.

This wrapped up our visit of Sydney Sussex College and the icing on the cake, we some had some free time to roam around Cambridge town centre.

For us the highlight of this whole trip was our Q&A with the current students of Cambridge University. This is because to talk to people near the same age bracket as us meant that they made some very relatable points, which helped us understand university life even more.


